



## **Recipe of the Month**

Thanks again to Rowan Price for this tasty recipe for May

## **Spring Risotto**

Serves: 4

Total Time: 40 Minutes



### Ingredients

25g Dried mushrooms (any) 250g Frozen peas 250g Risotto rice 125ml White wine 1.2l Vegetable stock 4 tbsp Dairy free "Butter"
1 Onion diced
2 garlic cloves crushed
15 Asparagus spears finely chopped into discs
Small bunch chives finely chopped

#### Method

2 tbsp Olive oil

- 1. Place the dried mushrooms in hot stock and let them soak.
- 2. Heat 2 tbsp of the butter and oil in a wide pan over a medium heat, and fry the onion for 5 to 10 mins until tender and translucent.
- 3. Add the garlic and fry for a minute.
- 4. Remove the dried mushrooms from the stock and add to the pan.
- 5. Fry for 8-10 mins or until tender and golden.
- 6. Stir in the rice and coat in the oil from the pan.
- 7. Add the wine and simmer for 2 mins to reduce.
- 8. Add the stock gradually, stirring regularly until absorbed before adding more.
- Keep adding and stirring for 20 mins until most of the stock has been absorbed and the rice is tender.
- Add the peas and asparagus and cook for 5 minutes until slightly tender.
- 11. Remove from the heat, stir the remaining 2 tbsp vegan butter and the herbs into the risotto, leave to stand for 5 minutes, covered, before serving.
